

## Fashionista Revelry

Revel in the ever-changing shades of the most colorful season—fall—and experience a "richer, refined and sophisticated moment with color," according to Pantone, Inc.'s Fashion Color Report Fall 2005. Driving designers this season are artful textiles and the English countryside, melting into a blur of bold, vibrant hues cascading together. Combinations make a statement as rich purples, deep oranges and reds, and earthy greens complement each other in design and arrangement.

"What is most directional for Fall 2005 is the intriguing combinations of color—Glazed Ginger and Moroccan Blue with the accent of Moss; or Rattan, Gloxinia and American Beauty," observes Leatrice Eiseman, executive director of Pantone Color Institute. "Blue turquoise, spring's dominant color, has matured into Moroccan Blue—a deep, vibrant teal. Rich browns also are extremely important for Fall '05, from spicy shades such as Glazed Ginger to darker chocolates. Meanwhile, Rattan exemplifies yellow's new burnished direction."

#### Mix and match

Playing with color captivates the eye as the overcast sky and declining temperatures begin to replace the months of summer. "The emotion of color—and we love all of those emotional moments—allows everyone to create their own moment," says Michael Fink, senior fashion director of Saks Fifth Avenue. "Take a chance—mix it up!"

Taking this to heart, designers this season have created looks inspired by the Native American community, a manor house nestled between tall lush woods, a courtyard filled with promenading peacocks and fairy tale princesses. Fantasies took shape in day-dreamed moments as gypsy designers scoured the globe in search of the ultimate muse. Their travels found inspiration in the luxurious, the chic and modern, the cool and vivacious nature surrounding them.

## Shades of Fall

The Pantone Color Institute is an independent company that standardizes the language of color. The color names that follow were assigned by Pantone, Inc.



Designers Alice Roi, Jeffrey Chow, Esteban Cortazar and Yigal Azrouel contrast dense, woodsy greens, such as Burnt Olive and Moss, with Burnt Orange. Lush and audacious, the red in Ruby Wine and American Beauty is rich and bold. Colors reminiscent of royalty include purple's Gloxinia, and the deep and vivid Moroccan Blue. Natural earthy tones appear this fall with stone-like Atmosphere and sandy Rattan. See Shades of Fall.

#### Layer a look

With such a bold palette to work with, create drama by overlaying unique combinations. Designers diverged from accessories to create a look, and relied heavily on fabric and color instead. Choosing from this season's new fashions may seem daunting, but color will be key. "The use of strong, bold, gorgeous color can help the consumer differentiate and navigate between the brands," says Simon Doonan, creative director of Barneys New York. Searching through clothes racks will be easier using color as a guide.

By layering, dimension is created with a unique punch. Mix bold hues with earth tones; or juxtapose small amounts of brighter shades under darker tones to add brilliance. Experts have capitalized on the richness of the season, combining eggplant and stone gray. More neutral looks can change dramatically by incorporating bold accents with a lively belt in Ruby Wine or contrasting a long trench in scarlet red with deep marine blue pumps. Keep it interesting, and don't be afraid to take a chance.

#### Dress up, darling!

Jackets are the essential from this season's runway. Strike a pose in a cashmere reversible clutch coat or a baby alpaca cropped flight jacket. With accessories toned down, use color and fur trim to create flair and pizazz. Try some of the following ideas from Pantone's experts to assemble your essential fall look.

- Pair the flirty skirts from spring with short, sculpted jackets.
- Use accents of velvet with tweed for luxurious detail.
- Choose coats and jackets with feather, crocodile or royal fox trim to create intrigue.
- Pull out wool, tweed, cashmere and mink fabric pieces, and layer them in interesting combinations.
- Let color speak for itself by making bold, dramatic choices.

With this color palette in hand, any look can go from drab to fab. Fall 2005 has diverged from the more traditional earth tones to a bold combination of natural and vibrant mixtures. Be inspired, and create drama.

### Marvelong Made-up Merriment

A dab of this and a dab of that can achieve daring, dramatic looks. With the colors available this season, makeup isn't to be taken too seriously. Following the fashion designers' lead, makeup lines have spiced up the season with bold hues. Warm yellows, soft purples, pulsating olives, natural blushes, luscious reds, rich browns and shimmering bronzes create subtle and seductive or bold and outrageous looks

Metallics and shimmers dazzle the eyes, providing makeup that pops. "It's all about texture: high gloss, shimmer or soft matte. Anything goes," says Dana Proctor, makeup artist for Sormé Professional Cosmetics. Mascara in gunmetal or smoky styles can create the desired sultry, sexy look. Dewy natural glows highlighted by a flush of creamy peach blush replace matte skin for a clean, fresh luxurious radiance. Berry-kissed lips pout with hues of raspberry, plum, magenta and fuchsia. Nail polish shades grace tips with sassy wine, spice, ginger and plum, shying away from the neutral colors of the summer.

Deepened shades from spring transform into fairy princess festivity with coral, sweet lavender, salmon and bud green. Slate and mustard combine to highlight the eyes and take precedence on the face. For a mod evening look, a fading sunset of brown and bronze complements big, teased hair reminiscent of the '80s. Entice with chocolate cat-eye accents and a luscious ruby-painted mouth.

#### Hair ball vixen

Pin up or blow out hair this season for every woman from working girl to belle of the ball. Dressing up hair will be evocative of playing dress up with girlfriends as pinup curls, beautiful buns, headbands and '60s retro become the fashion. Hair color sizzles with ruby, brunette and bronze—metallic undertones glistening beneath bold color—saying goodbye to highlights.

Eye-catching movement with unique uses of angles and shape characterizes the casual, yet intricate, styles. Texture plays a key role in expressing and highlighting the season's new hairstyles. "Transforming texture is key to achieving the look," says James Harris, master stylist for Mizani. "The transformation creates new surfaces, new reflections and new dimensions."

## Winter Play

Forecasting the cold, crisp winter months, Bohemian emotion introduces electric, colorful shades in winter 2005. Natural enchantment is elusive with soft, autumnal earth tones of reddish-brown, olive green and subdued orange. What changes from fall are the electrified colors of urban stoplight red, slate gray and electric green. Metallics fade to subtle powder, pearl and matte shimmer.
